The Franklin Initiative's Graduation Coach Initiative

- Individualized counseling using the Check & Connect model
- Career preparation
- Focused on students struggling in high school
- Goal: high school diploma attainment



Ivy Tech's College Connection Coach Initiative

- College transition services, assistance with admissions applications, financial aid, and college visits
- Assistance with exploring careers, education, and training options
- Development of an academic/career plan
- Assistance reviewing career assessments (www.indianacareerexplorer.org)
- Career planning





Pilot Graduation and Career Coaching Initiative

Aimed at improving graduation rates and preparing students for pathways into technical certifications, associate degrees, and other postsecondary degree programs.

- Individualized high school completion plans, including ensuring students attend school, arrive on time, fulfill academic requirements and graduate with a high school diploma.
- Opportunities for students to experience and participate in work-based learning initiatives.
- Career learning activities such as mock interviews, financial literacy training, soft skill training, and college and industry visits.
- Partnership with Ivy Tech Bloomington who employ and supervise coaches. Training provided by ROI and Ivy Tech. Funding from ROI.

Funding Process

- Competitive request for proposal (RFP) process
 - RFP's were reviewed by a committee made up of ROI and Ivy Tech members
 - Scored each RFP using a rubric quality of application and impact
 - Conversated and agreed upon recipients
- 27 school districts in Southwest Central Indiana
 - 12 school districts responded
 - 8 school districts were funded
- 3 additional school districts self-fund their participation and involvement in the program
- 1 of the 3 self-funded school districts raised the necessary funding through their county and have a full-time Graduation and Career Coach



Hiring Process

- Positions were posted on Ivy Tech's employment website in addition to other employment sites (i.e. indeed.com)
- Applicants reviewed/selected initially by ROI and Ivy Tech
- Round 1 interviews conducted by a committee comprised of ROI, Ivy Tech and two Graduation Coaches already in place
- Candidates selected for Round 2 by the initial committee
- Round 2 interviews conducted by a committee comprised of ROI, Ivy Tech and the school district
- Final hiring decision made by ROI and Ivy Tech

Implementation Process

One week training on Ivy Tech's campus prior to going into the high school's

- Provided detailed information about the initiative:
 - The importance of the initiative
 - Additional training that would be provided
- Provided documents to be used when meeting with students initially:
 - Career Plan
 - Stay In School Plan
 - Student Plan of Care
 - Student Survey
- Data tracking requirements
- Met with the college Chancellor and the Community Foundation of Bloomington and Monroe County's President and CEO



Implementation Process

- Several team building activities
- Learned about the Graduation and Career Coach role
 - A day in the life of a coach
 - Expectations and goals for the initiative
- Talk/Tours with several of the college program chairs and deans to learn more about the programs that Ivy Tech has to offer
- Training Sessions
 - Check & Connect Training
 - All of our coaches, in addition to some other high school administrators, attended Check & Connect Mentor Training
 - WorkKeys
 - Indiana Career Connect
 - Indiana Career Explorer

A Day in the Life of a Graduation and Career Coach

- Review student records (attendance, discipline, grades)
- Be visible to students
- Attend any meetings as necessary
- Maintain strong communication (students/teachers/administration/guidance)
- Make referrals to social worker, outside agency, etc
- Track data and success stories
- Home visits as necessary

Consistencies

- While all these factors create different atmospheres to work in, there are consistencies throughout our work.
- We:
 - Believe all students are capable of success
 - Create support systems and safe spaces for our students
 - Never judge a student's choices or actions
 - Provide honest and level-headed feedback
 - Spotlight positives in individuals
 - Are patient and persistent
 - Respect and value all students



A Meeting in the Life... (activity)

- For experienced and inexperienced mentors
- You are either a Graduation and Career Coach or a student

Student:

- How are you feeling?
- What are you thinking?
- Is there an issue with the school, your family, or your friends?

Coach:

- Do you focus on the student's grades?
- How are you actively problem-solving?
- What kind of approach do you want to take with your student?
