

Emotional Boundaries



Teachers need to be able to mask and control their emotions

Power Boundaries



Use authority to harm a student

Institutional Boundaries



School and district rules, policies and practices

Financial Boundaries



A teacher or counselor providing their own money to students or buying items for the students

Communication Boundaries



Talking about highly personal subject matter with the student; breaches in confidentiality; includes social media

Temporal Boundaries



Spending too much time with one student

Expertise Boundaries



Not having the training to deal with certain student situations


